April Showers bring May Flowers?

Has anyone noticed that it's still raining? We did have one week of really nice weather. We were thinking we'd be able to aerify and be ready for summer by the first part of April. As well, we'd be opening fairways to carts— However, all that is on hold right now. We'll aim for the middle of April (weather dependent) for aerifying. We're currently prepping the greens with that goal in mind. Carts off the cart path? Anyone's guess.

Another sign of spring is the wildlife (We'll refrain from talking about the Elk for one newsletter). We're seeing turkeys and deer around that look like they are "nesting" so it won't be long till some little ones appear. Several steelhead have also been spotted in Jacks Creek—ready to spawn.

With spring rates going into effect on 4/1 we have modified some of our policies regarding cart rentals. Our discounted tee times (Senior rates, Twilight, Men's Day, Ladies Day) are all predicated on sharing a cart. We understand people don't always have someone to golf with, and there aren't always people around waiting to share a cart. With this scenario, if someone doesn't want to wait to share a cart, we will be adding a "single rider" cart fee. We are also looking to get some single rider carts that would not require an additional fee. The Proshop staff is more than willing to talk with you if you have questions regarding this new policy. Salmon Run is very close to being self-sustaining—which has been our goal since day 1—and being more cognizant of our cart usage will help. Thanks for understanding and helping us achieve our goal.

Another big question we hear is about Hole #2. Broken pipes and a crushed culvert (deep underground) made for an incredible sink hole that has taken out the cart path near the green and flooded onto #3 during heavy rains. The City of Brookings used video scoping to identify the problems. It will take some creativity to solve the multitude of issues and get the hole safe for play. Thank you for your patience—we are hopeful to have #2 open again soon.

We are excited to announce the Fairway Café has been designated as one of the Wild Rivers Coast Food Trail establishments. We are partnering with several local businesses such as Rumiano Cheese, First Rise Bakery, Taylor Sausage, Langlois Market, Pacific Ocean Harvesters, Catalyst Seafood, Farmer's Market—and more. If you haven't tried the café, give it a go! It's always fresh and always homemade (including the cake).


We have quite a few tournaments scheduled for the summer—many are fundraising tournaments for local school teams. Get your groups together and help to support the cause.


