Last spring we made some equipment acquisitions that have truly been a game changer for us. The new machines are lighter and more reliable than the equipment we inherited with the course. These machines not only knock down the rough but their lighter footprint allows us to get on the fairways sooner than before. We haven't heard nearly as much about "lost my ball in the fairway rough" as in the past years. We are approaching our 4th anniversary at the course and things have come together—finally! While we're always dreaming of newer equipment, we're able to keep these older "new" pieces working good.

Just once we'd like to not include an "elk" report with our monthly newsletter. We don't know if it's due to the logging or the increased herd size but the elk have been relentless. We scooped over 250 pounds of elk droppings off 9, 10, 11, 12, 14, 16, 17 & 18 fairways. Gary and John V. spent 4 hours on their knees repairing the 9 & 18 green after a particularly extensive dance party by the herd. If you see someone from maintenance, give them your thanks for working hard to keep the course in good shape. Yes, the soft fairways are still pocked with footprints but we've fashioned a roller to help smooth those out. We've also hired a night watchman who is out there 2-3 nights week to keep the elk at bay. Maybe next month we won't have an elk report!

With spring fast approaching we're anxious to open the fairways to carts but there are just too many soft spots out there. Thank you to everyone for helping by staying on the cart paths during out cart path only months. Fixing ball marks on the greens is also very important—can't find yours? Fix another one you come across. Every little bit helps.
