Turkey Days Coming

October was a beautiful month for golfing. With only a few days of rain plus a few days of frost delays, the course stayed in great shape. The aeration healed quickly and play has been steady. Our first frost delay was October 26th and a few more days ensued until the end of the month. We're sure to have more so if you have an early tee time and don't want to wait at the course, give us a call to check conditions. With the time change on the morning of November 1st we will see earlier tee times available again.

Our Monday delay start will continue (and now it's even light!) This has been a great time for maintenance to get some critical projects completed without competing for the green or fairway. We are grateful for the patience of our early morning golfers.

Did you get your handicap letter this month? If so you would see Gary was honored as the November Superintendent of the Month by the Oregon Golf Course Superintendent Association and the OGA. He was nominated and asked to fill out the questionnaire so thank you to everyone who put his name forward. He continues to meet the challenges of the course and find the best way to get projects completed with this staff.

Some of those challenges have included a resurgence of elk on the course. We're still trying to determine timing for their entry so have cameras out there trying to capture that information. We have a night watchman who drives the course hoping to scare the elk as well. After the greenskeepers revenge (elk revenge tourney?!), and a skeleton crew on weekends, Gary fixed elk tracks across the greens for 3.5 hours. Not too many people noticed the damage since he spent the time fixing it but he was worn out and didn't get to golf that day!

Our driving range has been closed a few days while they worked along the back of the range clearing. Professional tree cutters had to come in to get the big stuff so we're only able to use short irons until the net can be moved to the back after the debris is cleared up. We recaptured a lot of golf balls when the first clearing happened but with all the trees on the grounds, and large equipment due to come in, we don't want to lose the rest of the driving range balls. We're hoping the work is completed quickly but most of it is volunteer labor (and equipment) so we'll be patient. You can still go hit punch shots and short irons to warm up before your round. Get the balls in the clubhouse.

We irrigated through the majority of October and had a few more breaks on lines. Thanks to the golfers who called in the major break on #6 that had a river running through it. We were able to open it and get it patched up quickly. Our lines are always "charged" as we need to water to roll out elk tracks so it's possible to see breaks like this even during the winter months.

As we begin our month of thankfulness, we would like to take this opportunity to thank all those who are on our staff—we hope you will join us in thanking them too. Tim, John M., John V., Dean, Kraig, Jeff, Jennifer, Mike, Matthew, Nathan, Mia, George, Wendy, David, Morgan all help to make our lives easier. We'd also like to say thank you to all the golfers, while we may not always have the right answers, or have the wanted permissions, our mission at Salmon Run has always been the same—provide an incredible golfing experience with friendly service—and failure is never an option.
